What your child will be learning about this term and how you can help at home

Autumn 2024

What we will be learning this term...

English

This term, Year 2 will be reading Ruby's Worry, Pretty Salma, Into The Forest, The Storm Whale and looking at animal poems to support their writing.

Grammar: The children will continue to use capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks to show the

end of a sentence. They will use adjectives to describe and begin to use verbs to make their writing more interesting. They will write in the past and present tense and begin to use commas to separate commas in a list.



Phonics: To help the

children to read and spell, they will have daily reading/phonics lessons. We will be using the *Read Write Inc.* scheme and then the children move onto a Guided Reading programme. The books will be sent home once the children are confident in reading them.

How you can help: Read with your child every day. Practise writing sentences using capital letters, full stops, commas and apostrophes correctly. Encourage your child to read different books and use these to inspire their writing.

Computing

IT Around Us and Creating Media: This term, the children will recognise common uses of information technology beyond school and create, organise, store, manipulate, and retrieve digital content.

Maths

The children will be learning the following:

- Find 10 more and 10 less than a number
- 10 times tables
- Count forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s
- learning number bonds to 20 and their related subtraction facts (e.g. 18 + 2 = 20,
- \bullet 2 + 18 = 20, 20 2 = 18, 20 18 = 2)
- Add and subtract a 2 digit and a 2 digit number
- Find 1/2, 1/4 and 3/4 of a shape or amount

How you can help: Practise telling the time at home to the nearest o'clock, half part the hour and quarter past the hour. Use 'Hit the Button' and Times Tables Rockstars to practise multiplication facts

Design Technology

Free Standing Structures: The children design and make a bridge for the Billy Goats Gruff.

Cutting and knife skills: The children design and make basic fruit smoothies.

Music

The children will be learning the fundamentals of beat and rhythm and exploring simple patterns. They will be learn about dynamics and how this can affect the emotions in music.



PE will take place on the following days:

Games

The children will learn to send and receive objects and begin to

play a wider range of games to build teamwork.



Gymnastics

The children will perform a range of balance actions and link with travelling.

Religious Education

What can stories teach us?: This term, the children will learn about why holy books are special, how people learn from them and why they are important to a believer.

PSHE

Relationships: The children will learn to recognise how other people are feeling and learn about sharing their own feelings with others. They will learn about positive relationships in their lives, including friends, family and communities.

Art

Drawing: This term, the children will discuss the use of shadows and identify light and dark and sketch to make quick records.

Painting: The children will learn basic colour theory and build confidence in using a paintbrush.

How can I help at home?

Make it clear that you value homework – set aside a specific time and area for your child to work on their homework.

Listen to your child read for 10 minutes every day and ask them questions about the text to help their understanding. Encourage your child to sound out words that they are unable to read by using their **phonics** (for example, c-a-t makes cat).

Encourage your child to re-tell the story they have just read.

Practise their number bonds within 20 and finding ten more and ten less than a number.

Help your child to be organised:

- ♦ Have you got your **book bag?** It needs to be in school **every day**.
- ♦ Are ALL your reading books inside it?
- Is your completed homework in there too? Collected on Tuesday
- Have you got your full PE kit?
- ♦ Y2 Honeysuckle: Tuesday
- ♦ Y2 Ash: Tuesday
- ♦ Y2 Hazel: Wednesday
