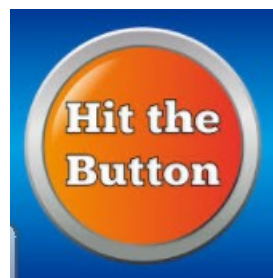
1. Read your reading book for 20 minutes each night.

Over the holiday research the Bronze Age and present your information. You could make a poster or leaflet. You might want to include:

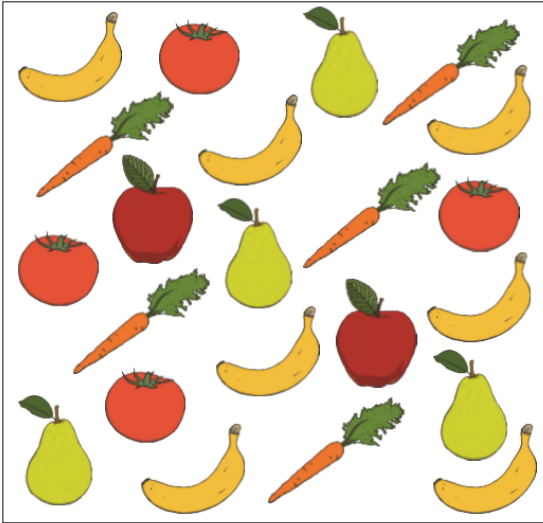
- What did people eat in the Bronze Age?

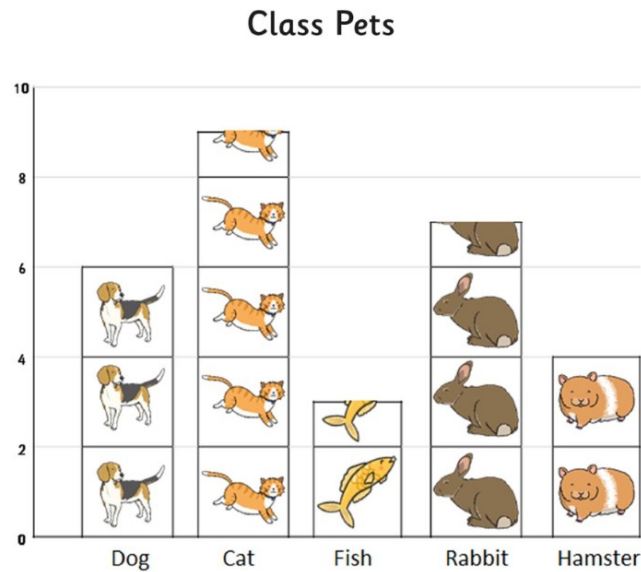
