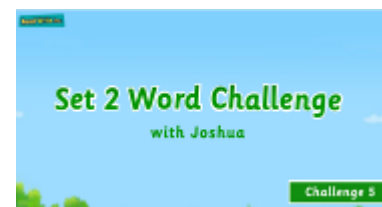
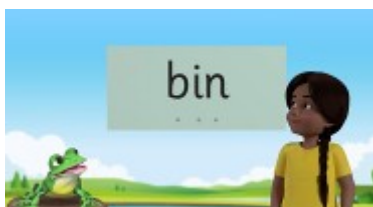
This week in Reception

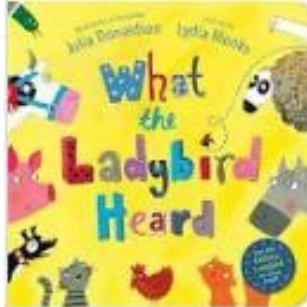




Next week in Reception
